<b>Title of the project</b>	Exploring the feasibility of providing immediate postpartum contraception with copper intrauterine devices in Gwagwalada Area council of the Federal Capital Territory of Nigeria.
<b>Comprehensive description of the project (max 200 words)</b>	Unmet need for family planning in Nigeria currently stands at 16 percent among married women. Immediate postpartum long-acting reversible contraception (LARC) has the potential to reduce unintended and short-interval pregnancy. However, provision of immediate postpartum contraception with LARC in Nigeria is practically non-existent due to lack of awareness, the population's socio-cultural health beliefs and lack of trained providers. We know that only 20.6% of women in Abuja use modern forms of contraception, and there is the absence of data about provision and use of immediate postpartum contraception in this area. This study aims to address this lack of data by assessing the feasibility of providing such a service through focusing on acceptability, demand, implementation and practicalities. We will obtain Institutional Ethics Committee approval. Acceptability will be assessed using a convenience sample of all pregnant women attending the obstetric service. A participant information leaflet will be given out, and those who elect to participate will complete a short questionnaire. We will assess the other areas of focus using standard feasibility study procedures. This study has the potential to fill a significant gap in the literature and inform efforts by stakeholders to increase access to modern and highly effective contraceptive methods.
